DROWNING IN STUDENT DEBT?

If you graduated from college in the past fifteen to twenty years, chances are you are still paying off your student loans. While massive, nation-wide student debt reform is needed, there may be hope for you right now. Teachers who teach in hard-to-staff schools, hard-to-staff subjects, or other high-need areas may be eligible for some forms of debt relief. Below are some specific categories. If they don't apply to you, be sure to visit our CTA Member Benefits website for a student loan flyer and for additional information and other helpful links. The site can be found at:

Stafford Loans:

If you have a Stafford Loan, teach five consecutive years in a "high impact school", and have not consolidated your loans, you may be eligible for \$5,000 or \$17,500 forgiven.

Perkins Loans:

If you have a Perkins Loan, teach a "shortage area content" in a "high impact school", and have not consolidated your loans, you may be eligible for a percentage of your student loan forgiven (15% for 1st and 2nd years, 20% for 3rd and 4th years, and 30% for 5th year).

PSLF Forgiveness:

You must make 120 on-time, full, scheduled monthly payments on your student loans under a qualifying repayment plan. When you make each of the 120 payments, you must be working full-time at a qualifying public service organization.
