#### **SDTA ELECTIONS RESULTS**

Thank you to our members who voted in our recent local elections. SDTA is happy to announce the re-election of Hai Nguyen at Carlmont High School and Alexandrina (Lexie) Pretto at Woodside High School. Menlo-Atherton re-elected grievance and bargaining team member Tim Bowler and two new representatives, Leia Asanuma and Cat Burton-Tillson. At Sequoia High School, Belén Álvarez-Iglesias and Jasmine Schimek were re-elected to their positions and we welcome Laura Larkin and José Rosario as new representatives. In addition, current CTA State Council Alternate **Dylan Shelley** was elected to a full 3-year term as SDTA's State Council Representative.

This election also marked SDTA's first foray into electronic balloting. While the feedback we received from members was overwhelmingly positive, the turnout was substantially lower than we have seen in recent elections. As the Legislative Council discusses how to proceed with future elections, we welcome member feedback on what hurdles there were that kept members from voting in the online election and how we might be able to provide for a more complete turnout in the future.

SDTA has vacant positions at all sites (except Sequoia) – if you are interested in pursuing an opportunity to support your colleagues as a representative, please contact the office as we will be looking to fill these vacancies in the fall.

# **BARGAINING UPDATE: CANVAS**

Based upon complaints related to security, privacy, and workability of the School Loop system, the District made presentations at school sites to various groups (Department Chairs or Shared Decision Making body) regarding implementation of Canvas as a new Learning Management System (LMS) to replace School Loop.

Upon hearing about these discussions from site representatives, SDTA initiated discussions with the District about the plans for implementation which led to negotiations at our latest bargaining session on the impact of that implementation at four school sites (Carlmont, M-A, Woodside, and EPAA) in the fall and at Sequoia in the 2018-19 school year.

The District has updated its "School Loop and Communication Requirements" memo, applying the same general requirements, which include use of the Canvas gradebook for posting of grades at least at every grading period, posting of due dates for homework assignments, and of descriptions and handouts for larger assignments.

SDTA consequently negotiated an update to the Side Letter Agreement related to the implementation of School Loop to update it for the shift to Canvas. The Side Letter specifies that only positive reference to use of the Canvas system shall be made in bargaining unit members' evaluations during the first year of implementation, while members are learning to use the system and also that until such time as the gradebook can be tailored to meet the needs of the continuation school, bargaining unit members at Redwood are exempted from requirements to use the gradebook. In coteaching pairs using the Canvas LMS, both coteachers will have equal access to all aspects of the class in Canvas and will establish shared responsibilities within the context of their coteaching relationship. The Side Letter also maintains the exceptions applied to teachers in the Independent Studies program and for those who teach four or more distinct preps.

Sites will continue to provide 120 minutes of unscheduled time per semester, in 20- to 60-minute increments, for the purpose of reimbursing members for the time spent working on complying with the LMS and communication requirements. In the first year of implementation of a new LMS (in this case, Canvas), there will be an additional 60 minutes per semester of optional technology training or individual time to work on maintaining LMS requirements.

Training in Canvas will be made available to members during the final weeks of the semester as well as during the June Professional Development Institute. If members avail themselves of these optional trainings, they will be excused from the mandatory LMS trainings offered during the site professional development day on August 15<sup>th</sup>.

#### MORE BARGAINING UPDATES

In addition to bargaining updates to the School Loop Side Letter, the bargaining team also tackled updates to the Side Letter that defines contractual differences for members at East Palo Alto Academy. While the proposed changes are extensive, they are not necessarily substantive, amounting to a reorganization of the side letter to focus on the areas where the agreements at EPAA differ from the SDTA-SUHSD contract. While both sides were in agreement at the table about the intention of the updates, the District delayed approval of the changes until further review by EPAA's site administration has been completed.

Discussions of the two side letters dominated the conversation at the April 26<sup>th</sup> bargaining session and while SDTA did make a verbal proposal for salary increase, no other items from either side's proposals were discussed. Bargaining will resume in May with negotiations scheduled for the 9<sup>th</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup>.
